A Simon Fraser University/Graduate Liberal Studies Travel-Study course

Berlin is one of the most dynamic and culturally creative cities in Europe. This course explores the history and culture of Berlin in the 20th and 21st centuries, focusing on the Weimar era, National Socialist period, World War II, Cold War, and post-unification Germany. Seminars, lectures, films, and field trips (museums, historical sites, cultural venues) provide students with an interdisciplinary and contextual learning experience.

The readings, lectures, films, and sites to be visited focus on two major themes or tensions that are inescapable when considering – and experiencing – the city of Berlin, namely, that of the interactions between outsiders and insiders and that of the past and present.
